

Update for residents affected by the Pigeon Valley Fire - Newsletter March 6 2019

This newsletter provides an update on the recovery phase management of the Pigeon Valley fire.

Fire update

The Pigeon Valley fire is now controlled and the notice to prepare to evacuate has been lifted.

We are still in a high fire risk situation. Please remember there is a total fire ban in place throughout the region. The machinery ban has been lifted but FENZ encourages businesses and farmers to register through the Tasman District Council website to receive daily fire risk updates.

The fire risk broadcast each day relates to a set of guidelines that for a given risk level indicates what equipment should be carried and what restrictions should be put on activities.

Community drop-in session

Collating damage

We are collating the damage on private properties as a result of the response to the fire. We will be contacting land owners that have been affected in the next two weeks to discuss remediation.

Government funding

We are meeting with the Government with the view to present an indicative cost of the damage to consider funding implications.

Fire breaks

Fire breaks constructed in response to the fire are no longer required. The containment line put in place by Fire and Emergency is sufficient to contain the fire. This means fire breaks can now be repaired and fences put back up. Property owners have the choice of reinstating what was there previously or to plant it with fire resilient planting.



Animal welfare

We urge people to access the support available. This includes the Rural Support Trust, the Federated Farmer's Feedline and National Animal Identification and Tracing (NAIT).

Free GP visits and pharmacy prescriptions: The usual fees for GP visits and pharmacy prescriptions will be waived for fire-related appointments. Please note: The usual fees for general GP visits (i.e. not related to stress or anxiety) apply again from 1 March.
