Civil Defence Centre closure and outreach visits

The Civil Defence Centre at New Life Church, at Wensley Road in Richmond has closed as of 4pm today.

Red Cross and Rural Support Trust volunteers will be making contact with residents in Eves, Teapot and Redwood Valleys later in the week to ensure everyone is in touch with the support services they need.

Fire update

Good weather conditions have aided the firefighting effort. Fire and Emergency New Zealand has achieved a 30-metre "blackout" zone around the entire perimeter of the fire, a goal they have been working towards for some time. Work is now focussed on expanding that zone to 50 metres.

The location and elimination of hotspots is also ongoing.



Access for contractors and machinery into the valleys

The state of civil defence emergency and the machinery ban remain in place but will be reviewed tomorrow Tuesday 26 February. In the meantime you can apply for an exemption (s91) by calling Tasman District Council 03 543 8400. The application form is on The Tasman District Council website.
